What things do you usually associate with these ideas? What hopes do you have? What fears do you have?

• The lyrics of this song are not very clear; they describe a situation, but they don't give us any context. We have to imagine the context.

What is happening in verse 1?
Who is the main character?
Why is she reminiscing? Why is she crying?
Why did the letter say goodbye? Who was the letter saying goodbye to?
How did she feel when she closed the door?

In verse 2, we have a description of "a boy with flowers". Why is he holding flowers? Who are they for? Why is he so anxious?

• The lyrics contain the phrase: "you miss all the shots that you don't take and they're the shots that you regret"

What does this mean? Do you agree?

Teacher's answer sheet. Length: approximately 40 - 50 minutes

Notice: Both the song and this worksheet are designed for intermediate & upper-intermediate level students. You can and should adapt the exercises according to your students' level.

### Pre-listening activities

- Look at the adverbs below. Do you know what they mean?
  - anxiously (nervously)
  - awkwardly (uncomfortably)
  - badly (not well / unsatisfactorily)
  - bravely (courageously)
  - foolishly (stupidly)
  - quietly (silently / in silence)
  - sadly (in a sad way)

- silently (in silence)
- slowly (not quickly)
- softly (quietly and delicately)
  (in a careful and gentle manner)
- fast (quickly)
- hard (normally: with a lot of effort) (in the song: violently)
- well (normally: correctly)
   (in the song: attentively)
- What actions can we describe with them?
  - anxiously: we waited anxiously for our exam results
  - awkwardly: he fell awkwardly to the ground and hit his head
  - badly: I sing very badly, so I'd prefer not to go to the karaoke with you tonight
  - bravely: the boy bravely walked out onto the stage and started to speak
  - foolishly: she foolishly let her baby brother look after the sweets
  - quietly: the two girls quietly played their game of chess
  - sadly: she sadly said goodbye to the man, before getting on the train
  - silently: the children studied silently
  - slowly: almost like a zombie, he slowly got out of bed
  - softly: he speaks so softly that I can hardly hear him / she softly caressed his head
  - fast: my dad drives really fast; one day he's going to have an accident
  - hard: we work hard / in rugby they play hard
  - well: he did his exam very well / listen well to what I'm telling you

Notice that adverbs of manner usually go <u>after</u> the verb.

Placing the adverb <u>before</u> the verb normally puts extra emphasis on the adverb.

The adverbs "well", "badly", "hard" & "fast" are <u>always</u> placed <u>after</u> the verb.

Students' own answers

• The lyrics of this song are not very clear; they describe a situation, but they don't give us any context. We have to imagine the context.

What is happening in verse 1?

Who is the main character?

A woman

Why is she reminiscing? Why is she crying?

She is remembering the good times in her relationship / marriage She is leaving her partner

Why did the letter say goodbye? Who was the letter saying goodbye to?

It is a goodbye letter for her partner

How did she feel when she closed the door?

"Alive"; which means "happy", "lively" or "in good spirits"

In verse 2, we have a description of "a boy with flowers".

Why is he holding flowers? Who are they for?

He is going to give them to a girl (and maybe ask her out on a date)

Why is he so anxious?

He is worried that the girl is going to reject him

• The lyrics contain the phrase: "you miss all the shots that you don't take and they're the shots that you regret"

What does this mean? Do you agree?

The first line is a quote by Wayne Gretzky; it means that you can't succeed if you don't try, which means you have to take action. The second line is a reference to a Mark Twain quote: "we regret the things we don't do more than the things we do."

Ask your students if they agree with this idea.
Then ask them if they regret doing anything, & if they regret NOT doing anything
