Teacher's answer sheet. Length: approximately 30 minutes

Put the verbs in brackets into either past continuous or past perfect. Remember to put the adverbs (never, even, even) between the two parts of the verb.

Then listen to see if you guessed right.

Note: There are several gaps which allow more than one tense; sometimes with similar meanings, sometimes with different ones. For example: "when he came to earth he wrote..."

"when he came to earth he was writing...".

If your students put a verb into a different tense to the one in the song, as long as it's correct, compare the phrases and discuss the difference in meaning.
